# **AGENDA HEADING:**

Approving exception to Request for Proposal (RFP) process for good cause and approving Professional Services Agreement (PSA) with Kirkham Michael & Associates, Inc. (KMA) for construction services for SE 9th Street Storm Water Pump Station and Improvements, not to exceed \$400,000.

### **SYNOPSIS:**

Recommend approval of exception to the Engineering Department's Request for Proposal process for good cause and approval of the PSA with KMA (Michael S. Olson, P.E, President, 12700 West Dodge Road, Omaha, NE, 68154), for a total cost not to exceed \$400,000, based on hourly rates, to provide construction services for SE 9th Street Storm Water Pump Station and Improvements.



### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

- On June 24, 2013, by Roll Call No. 13-1059, City Council approved the PSA with Stantec Consulting Services, Inc.(Stantec) for an assessment and analysis of the Des Moines Downtown Levee Systems relative to Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) accreditation requirements. This included identifying a plan of projects to both reduce flood risk within the levee areas and bring the levee system into compliance with the FEMA accreditation requirements. One (1) component of the plan identified the necessary improvements to the interior drainage pump stations along the DM-I, DM-II, and DM-III levee systems, required to meet FEMA criteria.
- On August 22, 2016, by Roll Call No. 16-1386, City Council approved the PSA with Stantec to
  provide design services for SE 9th Street Storm Water Pump Station and Improvements. As
  part of that PSA, Stantec will be supporting construction with shop drawing and change order
  review.

- The City Engineer recommends that good cause exists to exempt the procurement of these
  professional services from the Engineering Department's RFP process, including
  advertisement, in order to obtain construction phase services. KMA is qualified to perform the
  professional services and was selected to complete construction services for SE 9th Street
  Storm Water Pump Station and Improvements based on:
  - KMA was the local subconsultant to Stantec for design of the SE 9th Street Storm Water Pump Station and Improvement. Stantec's proposal included KMA providing survey, utility coordination, collection system design, construction phase support and related services.
  - KMA has previously provided construction phase services on many City projects and can efficiently manage City processes, utilities and other field services required during construction.
- City staff negotiated a PSA for SE 9th Street Storm Water Pump Station and Improvements with KMA for a total cost not to exceed \$400,000, based on hourly rates, to provide construction services.
