AGENDA HEADING:

Reprogramming of prior years' unspent Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding and other funds for the 2020 U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Consolidated Plan Programs.

SYNOPSIS:

Staff recommend approval of City Manager's recommendation for reprogramming unspent prior years' CDBG funds for the 2020 Action Plan.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$6,404,122

<u>Funding Source</u>: Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 Operating Budget, Community Development: Special Revenue Funds, CDBG Fund, Page 61; HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) Fund, Page 61; Homeless Fund, Page 61.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- On November 4, 2019, the City Council approved the 2020 Action Plan based on funding estimates. On February 19, 2020, HUD announced the City's allocation amounts for the CDBG, HOME, and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Programs. The following is an analysis of the funding estimates used to plan for the 2020 Program Year and the actual amounts.
- For CDBG in 2020, the City will receive \$3,792,908, which is an increase of \$134,938. After subtracting the amount for administration (20%) the City will have \$3,034,327 to allocate for projects.
- Additionally, it is being recommended to reprogram the following \$1,273,772.02 of unspent funding:
 - o Central Iowa Shelter & Services \$4,953.33
 - o Demolition \$448,239.91
 - o Economic Development Neighborhood Commercial Revitalization \$341,666.13
 - o Economic Development Financial Assistance \$260,370.53
 - o Economic Development Revolving Loan \$218,542.12

• This allows \$4,308,099 to be allocated for projects. The funding recommendations for the 2020 Action Plan are consistent with the 5-year strategy for our consolidated plan. Please see below for detailed funding:

- For HOME in 2020, the City will receive \$1,016,025, which is an increase of \$57,293. After subtracting the amount for administration (10%) the City will have \$914,423 to allocate for projects. Like in the past, this funding is being recommended for allocation to the Neighborhood Conservation Services Division.
- For ESG in 2020, the City will receive \$321,417, which is an increase of \$8,129. After subtracting the amount for administration (7.5%) the City will have \$287,669 for projects. The Continuum of Care (COC) Grant Committee will meet to allocate this funding and make a recommendation to the COC Board, the Homeless Coordinating Council (HCC), and the City Council for approval.
