Hold hearing to review the anticipated environmental impact of the Western Ingersoll Sewer Separation Project and to make the environmental information document available.

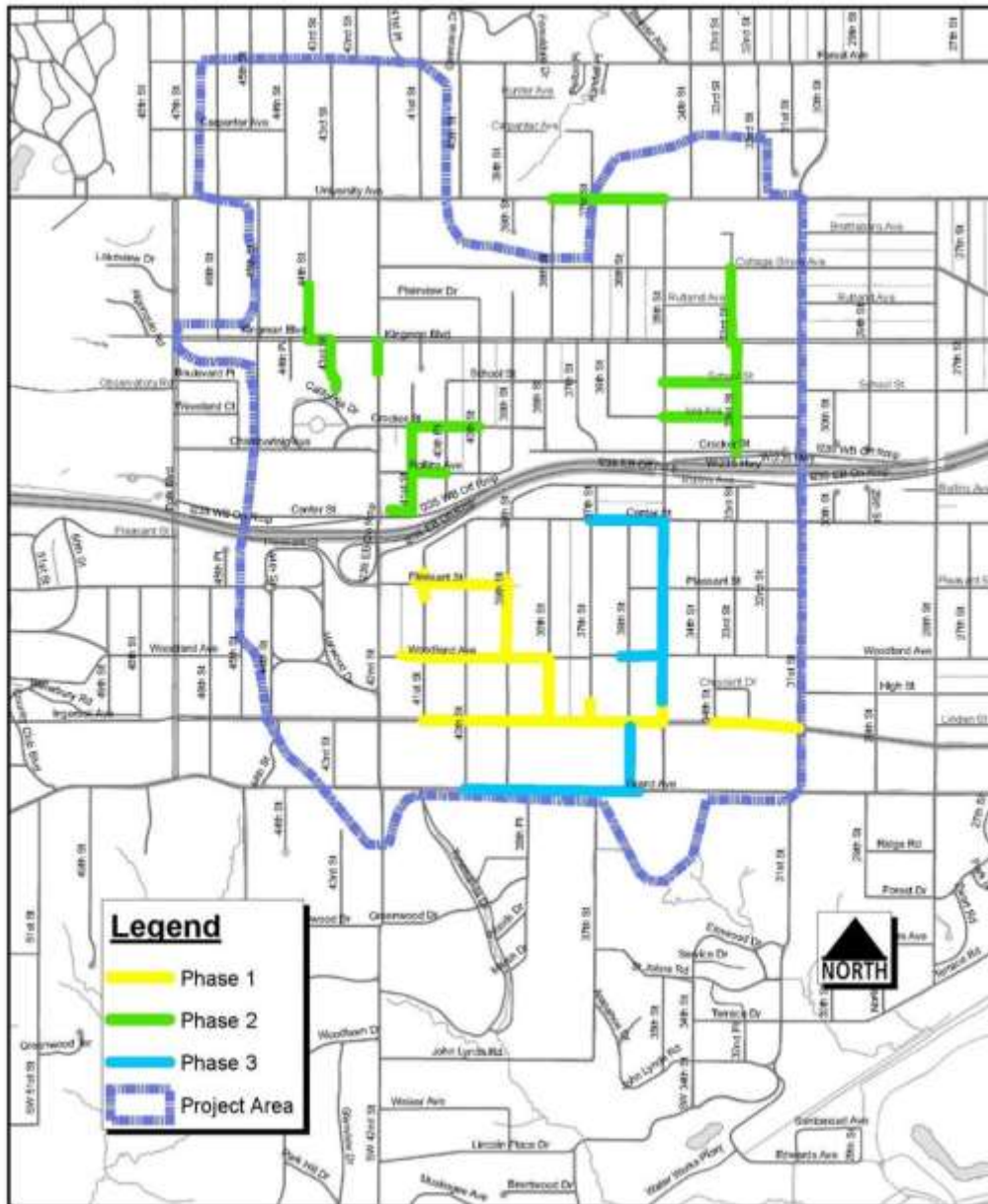
SYNOPSIS:

The City of Des Moines must hold a public hearing to inform area residents of the proposed Western Ingersoll Sewer Separation Project to discuss the anticipated environmental impact.

FISCAL IMPACT: NONE

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- On March 23, 2020, by Roll Call No. 20-0522, the City Council of the City of Des Moines, Iowa set the time and place for a public hearing on May 4, 2020 at 5:00 p.m., to inform area residents of the proposed project, to discuss the potential environmental impact of the proposed project to the community as determined by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) Environmental Review, and to address area residents' concerns, if any, with the project, which is to be known as the Western Ingersoll Sewer Separation Project.
- The Western Ingersoll Sewer Separation Project includes the removal of storm water intakes, catch basins, and inlets from the combined sewer system within the project area.
- The State of Iowa Clean Water State Revolving Fund loan program requires the City of Des Moines to hold a public hearing to inform area residents of the proposed project, to discuss the potential environmental impact of the proposed project to the community as determined by the IDNR Environmental Review, and to address area residents' concerns, if any, with the project. This public meeting must be held before the City can proceed with the project.
