AGENDA HEADING:

Approving notice of public hearing for an amendment to the franchise ordinance.

SYNOPSIS:

The City is looking to end the temporary increase to 7.5% on the electric energy and gas franchise. The additional 2.5% temporary increase was approved through June 30, 2021. The City will be able to end the additional fee almost a year early.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: Approximately \$6.4 million each of the last two (2) fiscal years (FY).

Funding Source: 2020-2021 Operating Budget, page 101, S605, Franchise Fee Settlement

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

• The additional 2.5% in franchise fee has been collected to pay for the \$38,830,000 general obligation bonds, series 2014A that was issued on January 6, 2014. The revenue for a partial quarter ending September 30, 2020 should be enough to pay for the final outstanding bond maturing on June 1, 2021. The City will redeem early the final amount outstanding when the City receives the fund from Mid-American Energy for the partial quarter ending September 30, 2020.
