### AGENDA HEADING:

Set date for public hearing regarding the issuance of bonds for the fiscal year (FY) 2021 Capital Improvements Budget.

### SYNOPSIS:

Set date for 13 public hearings and direct publication of notices regarding the issuance of General Obligation (GO) bonds and Stormwater Revenue bonds to fund the FY 2021 Capital Improvements Program (CIP). This is the first step in the process to finance the construction of capital projects totaling \$121,365,000 based on project costs with a not to exceed issuance of \$129,700,000.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$121,365,000 project funds plus interest and to be determined issuance cost (\$1,450,000 in FY 2019); FY 2020-21 debt service payment is estimated at \$3,032,023

Funding Source: FY2021 operating budget, property tax debt service levy, D001 ND400576

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- A public hearing must be held prior to any borrowing by the City. This hearing is to consider borrowing for the council approved FY 2021 Capital Improvement budget that will be held on August 3, 2020.
- The final sizing of the bonds and publication of sale is anticipated no later than August 14, 2020. A special council meeting would be scheduled following the sale for the receipt of bids.
- City staff will continue to review GO funding needs to monitor if additional grant funding can reduce the amount of City debt issuance. Projects are summarized by category as follows:

GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS**

(Essential Corporate Purposes)

- a. the opening, widening, extending, grading, and draining of the right-of-way of streets, highways, avenues, alleys and public grounds, and marketplaces, and the removal and replacement of dead or diseased trees thereon;
- b. the construction, reconstruction, and repairing of any street improvements, bridges, grade crossing separations and approaches;
- c. the acquisition, installation, and repair of sidewalks, pedestrian walkways, under and overpasses, culverts, retaining walls, storm sewers, sanitary sewers, water service lines, street lighting, and traffic control devices;
- d. and the acquisition of any real estate needed for any of the foregoing purposes;
- e. acquisition, construction, reconstruction, and improvement of all waterways, and real and personal property, useful for the protection or reclamation of property situated within the corporate limits of cities from floods or high waters, and for the protection of property in cities from the effects of flood waters, including the deepening, widening, alteration, change, diversion, or other improvement of watercourses, within or without the City limits, the construction of levees, embankments, structures, impounding reservoirs, or conduits, and the establishment, improvement, and widening of streets, avenues, boulevards, and alleys across and adjacent to the project, as well as the development and beautification of the banks and other areas adjacent to flood control improvements;
- f. equipping of Fire and Police Departments;
- g. acquisition and improvement of real estate for cemeteries, and the construction, reconstruction, and repair of cemetery facilities;
- h. rehabilitation and improvement of parks already owned, including the removal, replacement and planting of trees in the parks, and facilities, equipment, and improvements commonly found in City parks;
- i. acquisition, restoration, or demolition of abandoned, dilapidated, or dangerous buildings, structures or properties or the abatement of a nuisance
