AGENDA HEADING:

Request acceptance of grant performance period extension for the Anti-Heroin grant through the Governor's Office of Drug Control Policy designated to reimburse law enforcement overtime associated with mid to high-level heroin investigations.

SYNOPSIS:

The Police Department requests approval to accept an extension of the performance period for the grant award from the Governor's Office of Drug Control Policy in the amount of \$7,777. The new performance period would be March 1, 2019 through June 30, 2021 with no match requirement. The funding is directed to support the law enforcement investigation of heroin related cases.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount: \$7,777

Funding Source: The Recommended Operating Budget for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2021
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ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The Police Department currently works closely with the Governor's Office of Drug Control Policy and other agencies to investigate heroin and other drug related cases. The grant funds were accepted during the March 23, 2020 meeting and are dedicated to the reimbursement of officer overtime spent on such cases. The grant original performance period has been extended one (1) year to March 1, 2019 through June 30, 2021.
