AGENDA HEADING:

Amending Chapter 42 of the Municipal Code to clarify what the City is authorized to remove when completing a property clean up.

SYNOPSIS:

The code change will allow the City to remove items added to the property after a notice of violation when the City conducts a cleanup.

FISCAL IMPACT: NONE

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The administrative hearing officers have been denying cleanup costs if a resident adds more items considered to create a nuisance after a notice of violation is sent out. The amendment will allow the City to remove and charge for materials added to those illegally stored material after the notice of violation has been issued for nuisances set forth in sections 42-348.2, 42-348.3, 42-348.4, 42-348.5, and 42-348.12, the notice shall also contain a statement that any other violation of these sections found on the property at the time of a City cleanup will be removed without further notice.
- Staff will resend a notice if the owner cleans up the material illegally stored under a notice of violation and new material has been moved onto the property.
- This should allow the City to collect the full cost of clean ups when additional items are added to the property in violation of Chapter 42 of the Municipal Code.
