AGENDA HEADING:

Hold public hearing regarding the issuance of Series 2021FGH bonds for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Capital Improvement Budget.

SYNOPSIS:

Hold 16 public hearings regarding the issuance of General Obligation (GO) bonds and Stormwater Revenue bonds to fund the FY 2022 Capital Improvements Program (CIP). This is the first step in the process to finance the construction of capital projects totaling \$129,745,000 on project costs with a not to exceed issuance of \$136,000,000.

FISCAL IMPACT:

General Obligation Bonds:

Amount: \$100,660,000 project funds plus interest and to be determined issuance cost; FY 2021-2022 debt service payment is estimated at \$8,684,370.

Funding Source: FY 2022 Operating Budget, Property Tax debt service levy, D001 ND400576.

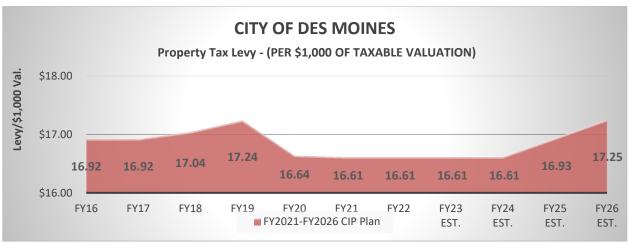
Stormwater Revenue Bonds:

Amount: \$26,600,000 in project costs and \$2,485,000 in debt reserve funds (\$29,085,000 total) project funds plus interest and to be determined issuance cost; FY 2021-2022 debt service payment is estimated at \$1,073,524.

<u>Funding Source</u>: FY 2022 operating budget, Stormwater Sinking Fund (Debt Service), E310 ND403630.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The final sizing of the bonds and publication of sale is anticipated no later than August 12, 2021. A special council meeting would be scheduled following the sale for the receipt of bids on Wednesday, August 18, 2021.
- After the setting of public hearing on July 19, 2021, Finance Department staff reviewed each project in detail to ensure the proper amount of bonds were being issued.
