AGENDA HEADING:

Approving and authorizing the execution of Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT) Agreement for E. 30th Street and E. University Avenue Intersection Improvements.

SYNOPSIS:

Recommend approval of IDOT Agreement No. 1-21-USTEP-027 for Urban-State Traffic Engineering Program (U-STEP) funding between the City of Des Moines and IDOT for E. 30th Street and E. University Avenue Intersection Improvements.

FISCAL IMPACT:


Amount: \$719,066.06

<u>Funding Source</u>: 2022-23 CIP, Page 140, East 30th Street and University Avenue, ST290, Being: \$357,000 in IDOT Traffic Safety Improvement Funds, \$200,000 in IDOT Urban State Traffic Engineering Program (USTEP) Funds, and the remaining \$162,066.06 in G.O. Bonds.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The E. 30th Street and E. University Avenue intersection was ranked 12th on the IDOT's Statewide Improvement Candidate List, which identifies the locations throughout the state in need of safety improvements.
- The E. 30th Street and E. University Avenue Intersection Improvements include:
 - o Traffic signal equipment replacement.
 - o Traffic signal retiming including the yellow change and red clearance intervals, and the addition of protected/permissive southbound left-turn phase with flashing yellow arrow.
 - o Median and pavement marking modifications to offset all left-turn lanes to create positive offset and better sight lines for drivers.
 - Removal of right-turn channelizing islands/medians to provide increased safety for pedestrians and remove traffic signal poles from islands.

- o Removal of yield-controlled northbound right-turn slip lane and addition of a signal controlled and dedicated northbound right turn-lane.
- o Pedestrian crossing improvements, including reconstruction pedestrian ramps at all corners of the intersection.
- On August 3, 2020, by Roll Call Number 20-1226, City Council authorized the submittal of FY2022 Traffic Safety Fund Application Applications to the IDOT. The City was awarded \$357,000 in FY2022 Traffic Safety Funds for the E. 30th Street and E. University Avenue Intersection Improvements project.
- On July 19, 2021, by Roll Call Number 21-1085, City Council approved and authorized the execution of IDOT Agreement No. 2022-TS-008 for \$357,000 in FY2022 Traffic Safety Funds for the E. 30th Street and E. University Avenue Intersection Improvements project.
- On December 20, 2021, under Roll Call Number 21-1976, the City Council approved plans and specifications for the E. 30th Street and E. University Avenue Intersection Improvements project and designated the lowest responsible bidder as Grimes Asphalt and Paving Corporation for \$719,066.06.
- IDOT also administers the Urban-State Traffic Engineering Program (U-STEP) with the intent to solve traffic operation and safety problems on primary roads in Iowa cities. U-STEP can provide up to a maximum of \$200,000 per project for spot improvements or up to a maximum of \$400,000 per project for linear improvements (projects which span two (2) or more intersections).
- On December 13, 2021, City staff submitted a letter request to IDOT requesting \$200,000 in U-STEP funding.
- IDOT District Office approved the request for U-STEP funding in the amount of \$200,000.
- Construction of this project is anticipated to begin in summer 2022 and be completed in fall 2022. No work or lane closures will be allowed during the Good Guys Car Show from July 1, 2022 to July 5, 2022, or during the Iowa State Fair between August 1, 2022 and August 26, 2022.
