# AGENDA HEADING:

- At least 80% of the CDBG-CV 2 funds must be expended by July 20, 2023. All funds must be expended by July 20, 2025, per the CDBG-CV application sent to IEDA. As of August 30, 2022, 55.48% of CDBG-CV 2 funds have been expended.
- There are a couple contracts that will need to be monitored more closely to ensure timely spending. Most subrecipient contracts end December 31, 2022, including those showing no expenditures. City staff will work with those who need extensions to ensure they spend down as much as possible before the City's contract with IEDA ends.

• The only known change to the activities is the potential reallocation of \$25,000 from Personal Protective Equipment, which the City will be unable to use because the Federal Emergency Management Agency also provided funding for this equipment. At this time, though, it has not been reallocated to a subrecipient.
