#### **AGENDA HEADING:**



## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

- The Des Moines Levee Alterations Phase C project includes improvements to the levee system along the Des Moines River from the confluence of the Raccoon River to S.E. 14<sup>th</sup> Street and is part of the City's Flood Mitigation Program with the goal of mitigating flood risk and meeting the requirements for Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) accreditation of the downtown levees. Improvements include earthen levee raises, gatewell structure modifications, pipe penetration improvements (sewer replacement and abandonments), and construction of seepage relief trenches to increase levee stability.
- On the north side of the Des Moines River and west of SE 14<sup>th</sup> Street, 1.74-acres of forested wetlands are to be removed as a part of the levee project to meet compensatory storage requirements. A mitigation bank is a wetland, stream or other aquatic resource area that has been restored, established, enhanced, or reserved for the purpose of providing compensation for unavoidable impacts to aquatic resources permitted under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act or a similar state or local wetland regulation. To compensate for the removal of the forested wetlands, City staff recommend purchasing credits with the C&W Hunter Mitigation Bank. The C&W Hunter Mitigation Bank, in close proximity to the levee project, is located northeast of Carlisle, Iowa along the Des Moines River and has also been determined by staff to be the most economical option for this project.

• A non-refundable 15% reservation fee to purchase 1.74-acres for \$113,100 (plus \$300 non-refundable application fee) is required by C&W Hunter Mitigation Bank. The project has submitted a check in the amount of \$16,965 that serves as the non-refundable 15% reservation fee for eventual purchase of 1.74-acres of forested wetland credits when they become available.
