### **AGENDA HEADING:**

First consideration to amend Chapters 26 and 46 of the Municipal Code to adopt the 2021 editions of the International Building Code; International Residential Code; International Existing Building Code; and International Fire Code.

#### **SYNOPSIS:**

Approval of this action amends Chapter 26 of the Municipal Code by amending and adopting the most recent published editions of the following codes:

- o 2021 International Building Code (IBC)
- o 2021 International Residential Code (IRC)
- o 2021 International Existing Building Code (IEBC)
- o 2021 International Fire Code (IFC)

#### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

- The City of Des Moines Building & Fire Code Board of Appeals has reviewed and recommends adoption of the codes and amendments listed in this section.
- o Adoption of these codes follows the recommendation of the Central Iowa Code Consortium.
- O Adopting these codes and amendments supports the City's goals for sustainable governance and reducing energy consumption through a unified code adoption process.

### The following summarizes amendments to Chapter 26:

- Adopts the 2021 editions of the IRC, IBC, and IEBC. Amendments in this article are consistent with those proposed by the Central Iowa Code Consortium. Notable amendments include the following:
  - ➤ Construction requirements for mass timber buildings
  - ➤ Use of intermodal shipping containers as a building material
  - Updated accessibility standards

The following summarizes amendments to Chapter 46:

- Chapter 46 is the City Fire Code. The fire code, like the other codes, was reviewed through the Central Iowa Code Consortium (CICC) process. CICC and staff recommendations items have been incorporated into Chapter 46. The most notable changes being the following:
  - Added requirement for Emergency fuel shut off require for new fire pit installations (commercial buildings)
  - Adding an exemption for Tent Permits (allows 10 x 10s without a permit)
  - Adding an exemption to allow new small buildings to be further from a fire hydrant
  - Requirement for new fire alarm systems to be an addressable type
  - > Requirement for the specific address of a fire alarm device to be transmitted to the monitoring agency.
