PUBLIC HEARING FOR REPROGRAMMING OF PRIOR YEARS' UNSPENT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDS, A SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO THE 2023 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN, AND APPROVAL OF RELATED GRANT AGREEMENTS WITH THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (HUD) UNDER THE 2020-2024 CONSOLIDATED PLAN

WHEREAS, on November 4, 2019, by Roll Call No. 19-1792, the City Council held a public hearing regarding the proposed 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan, which outlines the City's five-year strategy for use of its entitlement funds such as Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program, and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and authorized the City Manager to submit the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan to HUD; and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2022, by Roll Call No. 22-1760, the City Council held a public hearing regarding the proposed 2023 Action Plan, as part of the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan, and authorized and directed the City Manager to submit the 2023 Action Plan with the required SF-424 application forms and required certifications to HUD; and

WHEREAS, on February 9, 2023, HUD's Office of Community Planning and Development issued notice 23-01 instructing entitlement communities, such as the City of Des Moines, to delay submission of their Annual Action Plans until after HUD announces the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 allocations; and

WHEREAS, on February 27, 2023, Congress passed the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023, which included HUD's Fiscal Year 2023 appropriations in Public Law 117-164; and

WHEREAS, the City has 60 days from HUD's allocation announcement to submit its 2023 Annual Action Plan, which will be on or around April 28, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the City's 2023 Annual Action Plan requires a Substantial Amendment, reallocating previous years' CDBG funding into affordable housing projects, primarily owner-occupied housing repair; and

WHEREAS, persuant to Title 24 in the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 91, the City must provide residents with reasonable notice and an opportunity to comment on substantial amendments, providing at least 30 calendar days to receive comments before the substantial amendment is submitted to HUD and implemented; and

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2023, by Roll Call No. 23-0301, in compliance with the HUD regulations, the City Council set a public hearing for April 10, 2023 at 5:00 p.m. to obtain citizen comments regarding the Substantial Amendment to the Annual Action Plan for the 2023 Program Year; and

WHEREAS, due notice of the public hearing was published in the Des Moines Register on March 10, 2023, and hard copies of the proposed Substantial Amendment for the 2023 Program Year were available at all of the Des Moines Public Library branches and a virtual copy was posted on the city's web site, dsm.city, in order to provide citizens with the opportunity to participate in the hearing; and

City of Des Moines Proposed Substantial Amendment to the 2023 Annual Action Plan Draft for Public Review March 10, 2023

Summary

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) determines the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) amount that The City of Des Moines receives each year in the form of an entitlement grant based on city population, proportion of low- and moderate-income residents, and other demographic factors. If funds are not expended during the program year for which they are allocated, they must be reallocated to a program in a following year.

The Substantial Amendment is necessary because it meets at least one of the criteria listed in the City's Citizen Participation Plan as part of the Consolidated Plan.

The Annual Action Plan documents the federally funded objectives, activities, and outcomes for the upcoming program year. The City of Des Moines proposes to amend its 2023 Annual Action Plan by reallocating 2021 and 2022 CDBG funds that were unspent due to staff shortage, slow implementation of the owner-occupied housing rehab program, lack of marketing and underutilization of housing development site preparation funds, slow subrecipient spending for public service contracts, and simultaneous administration of Coronavirus Aid Relief and Economic Security (CARES) and American Rescue Plan (ARP) Acts.

Fiscal Impact

The total amount of funds that must be reallocated is \$3,042,340.20.

Staff recommends \$2,046,044.52 be reallocated to owner occupied repairs. Funding will assist low- and moderate-income homeowners repair their deteriorating properties. The additional funding will greatly increase the expected number of homeowner housing units that can be repaired.

Eligibility

Funding will be reallocated to activities that are eligible uses of CDBG funds as permitted under 24 CFR 570.202.

Public Comment

In accordance with HUD regulations and the City's Citizen Participation Plan as part of the Consolidated Plan, a public hearing is scheduled for April 10, 2023. A notice of public hearing is posted in the Des Moines Register on March 10, 2023. The Substantial Amendment will be posted to the city's website and distributed to all Des Moines Public Library Locations on March 10, 2023 as well. A summary of public comments received will be attached to the final version of the Substantial Amendment submitted to HUD.
