- 1. - 2. The public hearing on the amendment to the City's annual budget for the current fiscal year ending June 30, 2021 is hereby fixed and set for the 19th day of October, 2020 at 5:00 o'clock p.m. in the 2nd Floor, MSC Board Room, Richard A. Clark Municipal Services Center, Des Moines, Iowa, at which time any resident or taxpayer of the City may present objections to any part of the proposed budget amendment and change or arguments in favor of any part of the proposed budget amendment and change and in accordance with the Governor and Mayor Proclamations related to the COVID-19 outbreak and the City Manager's decision to delay the opening of City buildings to the public, it is impossible and impractical to have physical public
